FROM NURSE TOBY

Please remember that Ma-Tov is a peanut free camp. Please do not send snacks to camp that contain nuts, peanuts or traces of nuts. Since the number of children with significant allergies is increasing we ask that you take a little extra time in choosing the snacks that your child may bring to camp to help protect everyone's safety.

Please **do not send** your child to camp if s/he is showing any signs of illness, such as fever, vomiting, diarrhea or pink eye. We appreciate your assistance with regard to these health matters.

Attention—Important Items

- 1. Please LABEL ALL CLOTHING and items brought to camp. Do not send expensive clothing or towels to camp as they are easily lost
- 2. A lost and found area will be set up in and around the cubby areas.
- 3. Your child should wear sneakers and socks to camp. No sandals please.
- 4. If your child wears goggles in the pool please label them with your child's full name.
- 5. When swim is scheduled for first period, coming in a bathing suit is often helpful especially for the younger campers.
- 6. Sending a change of clothing in a Zip-Lock bag, properly labeled can often save some tears.
- 7. Electronic games such as Game boys, Palm Pilots, and/or cash **should not be brought to camp** as they interfere with activities and are easily lost.
